And as a witness, as a **digital witness**, or as a **digital disciple maker above** everything else, you do not want to become the kind of individual that, for the sake of winning clout, for the sake of gaining a large audience, is willing to make compromises in the type of content, in the type of persona, and in the words and images, videos, etc.
